Attendance

Our school attendance remains good at 95.7% but it is not as high as it was during the Autumn and Spring terms. One big factor in this is term time holidays. We have a new Education Welfare Officer working with school, Emma Etches, who will be looking at our school attendance. She will then be working with families to offer support in raising attendance. For a child to have 'average ' attendance the government sets the benchmark at 96%. Anything below 96% is classed as a concern and if attendance drops below 90% it is classed as persistently absent.
