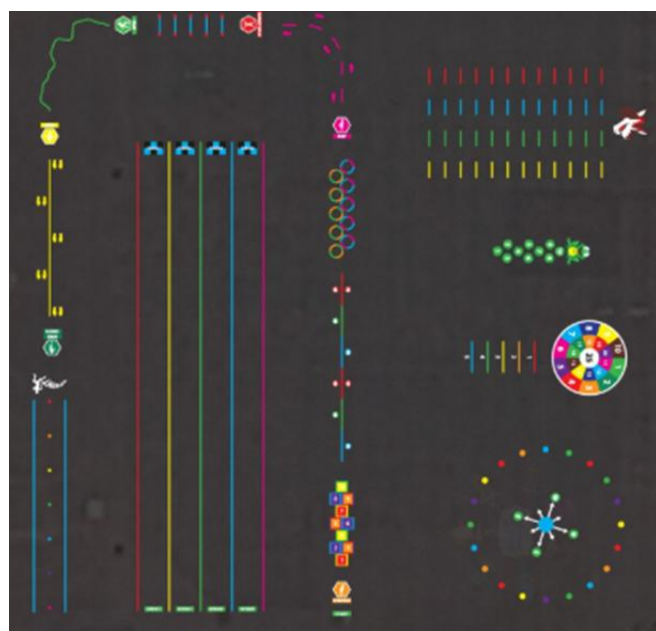
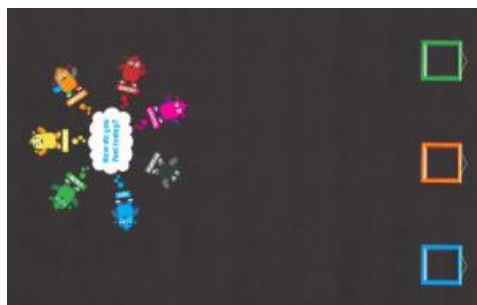

We have a number of children who are arriving at school late each morning. The school gates are open at 8:40am and registers are taken at 8:50am. We expect all children to be sat in class ready to start lessons at 8:50am. Please allow your children time to come into school, take off bags and coats and make their way into class. Even if the school gate is still open, your child will still get a late mark if they are not in class by 8:50am. If the gate is closed, children need to enter school via the main entrance.

For children in Nursery – The window for applications to primary school is now open and closes on the 15th January 2026. This year we had close to 70 applications for our 30 places. **If your child attends St. Mary's Nursery – this does not automatically entitle you to a place in our Reception class. You must still apply via Tameside.**

If you have applied, and your child is baptised Catholic, please share your baptism certificate with the office staff. This will ensure your child is in the correct category when all the applications are ranked against our admissions criteria.
