The Relics of St Carlo Acutis

Last Friday, 6 of our pupils were invited to St. Patrick's Church in Collyhurst to attend a special event to celebrate the relics of St. Carlo Acutis visiting Salford Diocese. Carlo is the first millennial saint, and is celebrated for his profound faith and his use of the internet to log Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He was passionate about spreading the teachings of the Catholic Church up until his death from leukaemia at the age of 15.

It was a very moving experience for the children, not only got to see the relics up close, but also got to hold and touch them. There were 2 sets of relics on show – the main relic was a small 6cm piece of Carlo's pericardium, the membrane that surrounds the heart. The 2nd relic contained a smaller piece of Carlo's pericardium, some hair, a piece of Carlo's favourite t-shirt and a piece of the cloth which cover his body after his death.

After learning about the relics, the children took part in a prayer and liturgy service which involved their own personal intentions being taken to the tomb of Carlo in Assisi, a small town in Italy. The children were a credit to the school and were reverent throughout the whole afternoon.
